Item 8: Pond Working Party

Meeting: Full Council on 28 August 2025

Motion: To discuss plan for delivery of the project and agree actions arising, including

creating a working party to start clearing non-organic debris from the pond.

Summary:

Ilmington Parish Council has secured a grant to support improvements to the pond on the Playing Fields. The project was originally proposed by and will be carried out in collaboration with Ilmington Wildlife Group. Planned works include clearance of debris and general tidying to improve habitat and amenity value. The Wildlife Group has confirmed it does not hold its own public liability insurance. This means that, if the project is to proceed, the Parish Council will be the responsible body for insurance and risk management.

Project delivery:

The project proposal involves (a) clearing the pond (b) restoring the water flow, (c) providing nesting boxes for barn owls and other birds, (d) enhancing pond margins to encourage water voles, and (e) new planting of marginal water plants.

Members of the Wildlife Group are eager to start work while the pond water level is low following the dry summer, which will make removal of debris, including old tyres, easier. The group has put out a call for volunteers to help with clearance.

Risk implications:

The Wildlife Group will provide volunteer support but does not have its own insurance. This means the Parish Council must act as the organiser, with the Council's public liability insurance applying to volunteers working under its direction.

Without Council oversight, the Parish Council's public liability insurance might not cover the activity, because it would no longer be a Council-organised event. This means any injury to volunteers, members of the public, or damage to property could leave the Council exposed to claims for compensation, particularly as the work is happening on Council-owned land.

Recommendation:

Pond clearance be treated as a Council-organised activity, with all volunteers regarded as working under the Council's direction.

A written risk assessment be prepared prior to works commencing (see Appendix).

A Council-appointed co-ordinator shall act as the point of contact with the Council for clearance activities and take responsibility for overseeing volunteer management.

Volunteers be required to sign in on the day, provide emergency contact details, and acknowledge receipt of the risk assessment for the activity.

Drowning or immersion in water	Serious injury or fatality	Volunteers, staff, contractors	Work in teams of at least two; no lone working; use bankside methods where possible; provide throw line or rescue pole; brief all workers on emergency procedures.	Low
Entrapment in soft mud or silt	Risk of becoming stuck, loss of balance, possible fall into water	Volunteers, staff, contractors	Test depth and firmness before entering; avoid working alone; use long-handled tools to reduce need to wade in; limit entry to shallow, stable areas only; provide rescue equipment (throw line, pole); brief team on safe assistance methods. Manual handling of heavy or awkward debris	Strains, sprains, back injury	Volunteers, staff, contractors	Practice safe lifting; use team lifts for heavy items; use barrows/buckets for transport; limit load sizes.	Low
Exposure to cold/wet conditions	Hypothermia, discomfort, reduced performance	Volunteers, staff, contractors	Wear weather-appropriate clothing; provide breaks and shelter; monitor for signs of cold stress.	Low
Contact with wildlife (e.g. wasps, rats, nesting birds)	Bites, stings, allergic reactions	Volunteers, staff, contractors	Brief workers to be observant; avoid disturbing nests; have first aid kit available; ensure allergy sufferers carry medication.	Low
Use of hand tools	Cuts, bruises, minor injury	Volunteers, staff, contractors	Check tools before use; provide training/briefing; use correct tool for job; store safely when not in use.	Low
